### Mathapelo Mokoena

'I started working at DCS in 2014. I had the privilege of working with Yolanda Van den Broek in Grade 3 in 2014 and 2015. From 2016 to 2018 I worked in Grade 1 and 2. I was assisting teachers in all of the classes I worked in. I have also been the First Aid officer at the school for the last 2 years as I am a qualified First Aider'.

So my aim was always to create a positive learning atmosphere in the classroom.

My time a DCS has been life changing and I will miss every staff member and all the amazing students very much. I am moving to Kwazulu-Natal because my husband Kobus, accepted a new post as a Regional Manager of the ACE schools in the Free State and Kwazulu-Natal. But I will definitely be back to visit this lovely school and the people I learned to love over the last 10 years'. During her time at DCS Adriani trained over four years and fully qualified as a teacher in 2017.


#### **Our New Sports Facilities**

#### The Eisteddfod Festival 2018 - Organised by Nicolene Van Wyk and Nadia Schultz


